## Dear Parent/Carer

Twelve months ago today we bade farewell to our Year 11 and Year 13 students, hoping that we might see them again, but we weren't certain and they never returned back to school in the academic year. The Prime Minister's Churchillian rhetoric remained just that as we were in the grip of a pandemic and entered into a lockdown. A year on we have learned a lot about ourselves and each other and I now believe we can move forward with some renewed hope and optimism to return to something bearing normality in the coming months, developing the best of what we have done differently, such as the online Parents' Evenings, and returning to the things that we know students have missed, such as the extracurricular activities.

The majority of students have had three Lateral Flow tests over the last two weeks, and we have had only one positive case which affected only a handful of students. All students been given their home tests, which we encourage them to use as we still have to be careful and work hard to remain safe. It is really important that results of tests are reported online straight away, even if the result is negative or void. Results can also be reported via telephone by calling 119 (free from mobiles and landlines). Lines are open every day, 7am to 11pm. Please also share your child's results with the school. There is some chaos and confusion around the exam system, as there was last year, but as I have written to the students and parents of Year 11 and 13, we have a way forward in the town's schools and I have tried to offer reassurance. For the rest of the school it is business as usual, albeit with some modifications and measures, but everyone seems to have got quickly back into the routines and rhythms of school life and will be looking forward to a break in two weeks' time.

## **Cashless catering**

Please can I remind parents that they should ensure there are sufficient funds on their child's account if they wish them to purchase food in the Chill. Although students are advised each time they go through till if their account is running low, overdrafts are only allowed in <u>exceptional circumstances</u> and it is the parent's responsibility to ensure that there is enough money on their child's account to pay for the food that they choose to eat. We will never let a child go hungry, but it may be useful for you to set an alert (either text or email) to remind you when the account is running low:
