# Independent Study Tasks Key Stage 3 History

- Produce a profile of a key historical figure or personality that you are studying at the moment.
- Use your class notes to build a timeline of key events and people. This will help you with sequencing and chronology. You can add to the timeline as you go through the year and as you do your background reading.
- Create a mind-map to organise your ideas about the topic that you are studying. You can use colour and illustrations to help you to learn and remember your facts, make links between events and make judgments about relative importance. The important thing is that you can remember the information so be creative!
- Create a self-test about a topic which you can re-visit regularly as part of ongoing revision.
- Do some reading and listen to relevant podcasts about History (see attached sheet for suggestions).
